We regret to announce the somewhat sudden death of another old colonist. At about half past four O'clock last Saturday afternoon Mrs Higham, a well-known and universally respected resident of Fremantle, quietly passed over to join lady of the great majority. The deceased had not been enjoying very good health to the previous few days, but no one expected her indisposition to have such a sudden fatal determination. Mrs. Higham was well known as being a most industrious tradeswoman, and was a firm and liberal supporter of the Congregational Church, of which she was an active member and zealous supporter. She leaves three sons - Edward Higham, Esq., M.L.C., J.P., Mr. John Higham, and Mr. Henry Higham - and one daughter - Mrs. Henry Saw - to mourn their irretrievable loss. Mr. Edward Higham returned on Sunday evening by the Rob Roy from the Nor' West, only just in time to see the mortal remains of his mother before her burial. The funeral took place this morning, when an unusually large number of relatives and friends availed, themselves of the last opportunity afforded them of paying the last token of respect to the memory of the deceased that lay in their power.

THE funeral of Mrs. Higham took place on Monday at 10.30 a.m. starting from the residence of her son-in-law Mr. H. J. Saw, where she breathed her last. A very large number of the leading residents as well as merchants of Perth and Fremantle attended the funeral, testifying to the respect in which the deceased was held by the various sections of the community. It is computed that close upon two hundred persons took part in the procession to the cemetery. Many of the places of business in Fremantle were closed in the morning, and nearly all had a portion of their shutters up as an indication of respect. The following gentlemen acted as pall-bearers, Major Sutherland, J. P., Messrs W. S. Pearce. J.P., W. E. Marmion, M.L.C. James Manning J. P., D. K. Congdon and Holman. The funeral ceremonies at the Johnston Memorial Chapel which the deceased regularly attended, were conducted by the Reverends T. C. Lawrence and Crawley.

Mr. E. Higham, whose death we recorded on Tuesday, was born in the County of Oxford, England, and was the eldest son of Mr. John Higham. He arrived in this colony, with his parents, when he was only seven years of age, in the year 1853. The Ven. Archdeacon Brown, and the Rev. J. Johnston and family were passengers in the same vessel, the Sabrina of Liverpool, which brought to this colony nearly 300 persons, adults and children. Mr. Higham's father commenced busi-ness in High Street, Fremantle, at first in a very small way, but by the aid of his wife, a person of remarkable energy and decision of character, he soon overcome the first difficulties incident to settlers in a new country. Mr. Higham senr., died in the year 1859, leaving a widow and four young children.

Generation 2 (cont.)

Edward, an intelligent and active boy, had then to leave school and assist his mother in the store, and in time, Mrs. Higham built up an extensive and remunerative business, the son in course of time becoming a partner in the firm of M. Higham & Son. Mrs. Higham died two years ago, bequeathing to her four children property of considerable value. Mr. Edward Higham endowed as he was with great energy and public spirit, soon began to take an active part in public affairs, and his sagacity, integrity of character and good sense, gradually gave him influence amongst his fellow townsmen. He was a useful member of the Road's Board, subsequently he was a member of the Town Council, now merged in the Corporation, and five years ago, he was sent by the electors of Fremantle as one of their representatives to the Legislative Council. He took a great interest in the volunteer movement, and entering the ranks as a private, he rose by degrees till he received the commission of lieutenant. Attached denominationally to the Congregational Church, he was an active member of the Finance Committee of that Body in Fremantle, and a liberal donor to its sustentation fund. Five years ago he married Miss Glyde, the third daughter of that respected citizen of Perth Mr. Geo. Glyde, M.L.C. and he leaves a widow to mourn his loss, and two little boys, too young to remember their father, removed at the comparatively early age of thirty nine. About a year ago Mr. Higham purchased the port mill, intending to carry it on as a commercial undertaking, and he had succeeded in putting it into good working order, when operations will have to be suspended by his death. As a husband and father and relative, he was kind and affectionate, as a citizen and man of business, he was respected for his truthfulness and integrity, and whilst charity throws a veil of forgetfulness over failings, from which none are free, the people of Fremantle mourn the loss of one who had done much good service to the community of which he was a member, and whose memory will be cherished by many who had been benefitted by his acts of kindness and generosity.

AN OLD PROPERTY.

FAMILY LITIGATION. Demands of Commerce. 'The effect on former residential property in Fremantle of the onward march of commerce was illustrated yesterday in a Supreme Court action before Mr. Justice Draper. The parties, concerned in the fate of the property, were Mrs. Johanna Mary Ann Elizabeth Saw. Lily Winifred Saw, and Henry James Saw (plaintiffs), and Ethel Mary Saw (defendant). Said by one valuer to be worth £18,000, and by another £20,400, the property is situated in Cantonment and Bay streets. It comprises an area of upwards of six roads, on which are ten houses, erected many years ago for residential purposes, and it is registered in the name of Mrs. Johanna Saw as the proprietor of an estate for life for her separate use. with the remainder to the other parties named (who are her children), as tenants in common in equal shares. Mrs. Saw is now 73 years of age. The houses on the property are used as boarding houses, patronised, it was stated by seamen waiting for ships, and others employed on the water, front. The plaintiffs' statement of claim set out that the locality had changed and become less suitable for residential purposes and the land could be utilised more advantageously by erecting commercial buildings on it. A sale of the property and an investment of the proceeds during the life of Mrs. Johanna Saw and, subject thereto, a division of such proceeds would be more beneficial than a division of the property. The plaintiffs claimed a division of the lands and a sale- and that they be authorised to lay proposals before a Judge in Chambers for his sanction as to the most beneficial method of carrying out the division of 'sale and the disposition of the pro-ceeds of any sale. The defendant, who was the only one of the parties to appear, made an agitated statement in the witness box in support of her desire that the whole of the property should be held as it was. She was opposed both to partition and to sale. Evidence was given also by two valuers. Mr. Justice Draper said there was no doubt that the locality was not now a residential area and he was satisfied that it would be advantageous for all those interested if the property were sold at its proper value. The conditions of sale should be approved by the Court, and a trustee should be appointed. The matter was adjourned for further consideration in Chambers. Sir Walter James. K.C.. with -Mm Mr. Gordon James, appeared for the plaintiffs, and Mr. M. G. Lavan for the defendant.

THE NEW MEMBER.

Mr. John Joseph Higham, the new member for Fremantle, is, as his predecessor was, a native of the town which he represents. He was born in September, 1856, his parents having only three years previously arrived in the colony. He began His education under Mr. George Bland Humble, the present town clerk of Fremantle, in the Government school at the Port. He afterwards spent some time at the Bishop's school, Perth, and finished his education at the Camden Collegiate school, N.S.W. In 1876 he returned to Western Australia, and entered into commercial pursuits at Fremantle, where he still carries on business. Mr. Higham has for a number of years taken considerable interest in local affairs, and during the last six years has been one of the representatives of the West Ward in the Fremantle Municipal Council. His father, who died when the subject of this notice was only two years of age, was the late John Henry Higham. He left behind him a widow (who was subsequently the senior partner in the firm of M. Higham and Sons, so well known in the Port), three sons, and one daughter. Mr. J. J. Higham, M.L. A., is a married man with a large family.

The late Mr. Harry J. W. Higham, who was a well-known West Australian pastoralist, was born in 1858 in Fremantle, and was educated there and at the Camden Collegiate School, Newtown, Sydney. Leaving school in 1876 he went into the north-western pastoral districts of Western Australia, and became interested in Nanutarra Station, on the Ashburton River, which he finally acquired in 1884, after which it was enlarged by the purchase of adjoining small stations. In 1886 he married Maud, daughter of the late Mr. John Bateman, and for many years Mr. and Mrs. Higham lived on the station, where they are still kindly remembered by the Ashburton community. In 1900 the family left the station, and for the last sixteen years have resided in Claremont, a picturesque suburb of Perth. Last year Mr. Higham visited the eastern States, and while there contracted pneumonia, from which he seemed never to have quite recovered, and his death resulted from a fresh attack at his home.

The deceased was a fine type of man, successful in everything he undertook, capable in every way, and unswervingly honourable. He was, for many years, a great worker for the Royal Agricultural Society, of which he was president for years. He leaves four sons.

**THE LATE MR. HARRY J. W. HIGHAM.
A PROMINENT PASTORALIST.**

Mr. Harry J. W. Higham, owner of "Nanutarra" station, Ashburton, passed away on the 18th inst at his late residence, "Nanutarra," College-avenue, Claremont, in his 59th year. The deceased gentleman was a son of one of the very oldest pioneers of the colony, Mr. John Henry Higham, who arrived here by the barque Sabrina, in June, 1853, or 24 years after the colony started. Mr. Higham's education was completed at Camden Collegiate School, Sydney, New South Wales, after which he returned to this State. In 1877 he went overland to the Ashburton, where he founded, what has since turned out one of the best pastoral propositions in the State, "Nanutarra" sheep station. He managed the place personally for 25 years, but for the last 15 years, he has lived a retired life, formerly at Fremantle and subsequently at Claremont. He was a past president and member of the Royal Agricultural Society in which he always took an active and keen interest. The Pastoralists' Association also claims him as one of its members. Mr. Higham took his recreation on the Bowling Green. He was a good bowler, and was formerly a member of the Fremantle Club, but at the time of his death he was a member of the Claremont Club. In 1884 he married Maud Mary, daughter of the late Mr. John Bateman, and leaves a grown-up family of

four sons and one daughter, to mourn their loss. The deceased gentleman was well known all over this State, and was highly respected by all with whom he came in contact. The funeral cortege moved from "Nanutarra," College-avenue, Claremont, on Saturday afternoon, the 20th inst., and proceeded to the Fremantle Cemetery, where the remains were interred in the Congregational portion. The Rev. G. H. Wright, who conducted a service at the residence, also officiated at the graveside, in the presence of the relatives, numerous friends, pastoralists, and old identities.
